#### Continuous Assessment Plan

##### Key Learning Objectives Assessment (KLOA) System of Counselor Competencies

- \* Learning objectives are assessed in each course each semester to determine level of student mastery.
- \* KLOA data are reviewed by faculty to assess student mastery and KLOA system reliability.
- \* KLOA annual results are reviewed with each student by faculty advisor.

##### Professional Development Assessments

- \* Advisor-Advisee conferences held annually to review the Professional Development Performance of each student.
- \* Faculty examines the Counselor Competencies Self-assessment and Professional Development Plan of each student at three stages during training.
